INVITATION

WELCOME

Deacon: Members and friends in Christ, we gather now to celebrate the gift of grace in the sacrament of baptism. Baptism with water and the Holy Spirit is the mark of acceptance into the care of Christ's church, the sign and seal of participation in God's forgiveness, and the beginning of new growth into full Christian faith and discipleship. Baptism is both God's gift and our faith response to that gift.

All: There is one body and one Spirit. There is one hope in God's call to us. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and creator of us all.

Introduction

Pastor: This is the water of baptism. Out of this water we rise with new life, one in Christ and members of Christ's body.

To the parents: You have brought your children here to receive the sacrament of Christian

baptism. As a sign of your faith response, I ask you to make the following promises: Megan and Tyler: do you desire to have your children Tanner and Tucker baptized into the Christian faith and the universal Church of Jesus Christ? Savannah and Michael, do you desire to have your child Charlotte baptized into

the Christian faith and the universal Church of Jesus Christ?

Parents: We do.

Pastor: Do you promise, with God's help, to teach your children about the love of God,

nurturing and leading your children to know Jesus Christ as God's Holy One and do you promise, according to the grace given you, to grow with and lead them

to an understanding of the Christian faith?

Parents: We do with the help of God.

Pastor: Do you promise, by the grace of God, to be Christ's disciples and to teach your

children by your own example and witness: to follow in the way of our Jesus, to resist evil, to show justice and love, to witness to the call of peace and justice?

Parents: We do with the help of God.

To members of the congregation:

Pastor: Jesus calls us to make disciples of all nations and to offer them the gift of grace

in baptism. Do you, the members of this faith community and the worldwide community of God's people receive these children into your love and care, and do you promise to show them and all children the unconditional love of God?

People: We promise our love, support and care, God being our helper.
