Job Summary:

This position will provide technical expertise and team leadership for sound, livestreaming, video recording, and projection related to the First Church's 10 AM Sunday worship service and other special events. The A/V coordinator must be capable of running the back-of-house system as well as training and managing a team of volunteers. Ultimately, the A/V Coordinator's goal is to ensure that services and events can utilize technology efficiently, effectively, and strategically to enhance the experience of those attending in person and online.

Essential Functions:

- Recruit, train, and schedule volunteers in areas of sound, livestreaming, video recording, and projection.
- Supervise A/V checks before the service and serve as technical support for A/V volunteers, troubleshooting any problems that arise throughout the course of the event.
- Confer with Lead Minister, Music Director, and Director of Congregational Life to establish cues and directions.
- When church volunteers are unavailable, run sound, manage projections, and switch between cameras for livestreams.
- Ensure that all livestreams are recorded and that these files are transferred to the correct location for post-production or archival purposes.
- Secure and maintain A/V equipment following use.

- Experience in broadcast media production, A/V, and/or event services.
- Strong communication and leadership skills.

- Grace and patience under pressure.
- Weekend availability (Particularly Sunday mornings).
