Who is our neighbor? What does it mean to love them? What does that love look like in action? In this five-week sermon series, we'll explore what it means to love our neighbor, *really*. As Rev. Marcia McFee says, "the Golden Rule in scripture challenges us to engage in conversation and seek to create whatever common good we can with our relatives, friends, and neighbors who we might consider to be on the "other side". As we attempt to come together, the idea is not that we are obliterating either one or trying to change each other, but rather we discover the beauty that can be created when we work together to make the world a better place."

What does it look like to have these conversations with kids? From 11:30 am - 12:30 pm in the Dining Room, Dir. of Faith Formation, Hilah Clarke is leading a seminar on how to talk with kids about people experiencing challenges with housing and addiction. Even if you don't have children, all are welcome to learn how to develop empathy through what can be challenging conversations.


Make A Joyful Noise to God
